In the case of any emergency it is important that you are prepared and know what to do. Unforeseen disasters can strike at any time.

In the event of an emergency

In the unlikely event of a breach of the dam, the response for the local community is to:

Evacuate to higher ground



What happens in an evacuation scenario?

In the event of an evacuation, Auckland Emergency Management may lead the community response. They have the best resources to coordinate an evacuation scenario.

In an emergency that requires a public response, information is likely to be available on a number of channels:



An emergency alert may be sent to mobile phones in the affected area



Notices on TV and radio



Emergency services may be on the ground in affected areas

How to get prepared

Have a plan:

- Have a getaway kit with essential items ready
- Know your evacuation route to higher ground

We also carry out significant work to replace, upgrade and build infrastructure, to maintain levels of services and provide capacity for a fast-growing population.


About the Rosedale Dam

The Rosedale Dam contains treated wastewater from the two large ponds associated with our Rosedale Wastewater Treatment Plant, situated at 2 Jack Hinton Drive, Albany.

The Rosedale Dam was built as part of the Rosedale Wastewater Treatment Plant which was opened in 1962. Since then the dam has been maintained and upgraded to continue to meet stringent engineering requirements and safety standards. It is constructed to withstand 'Maximum Credible Earthquake' and 'Probable Maximium Flood'.

At Watercare safety is our priority. We monitor the dam structure regularly and operate in accordance with strict regulatory requirements. We adhere to guidelines set by the New Zealand Society of Large Dams (NZSOLD).

While we monitor and maintain our assets to the highest safety standards, we also plan for worst case scenarios.

Safety plan

A safety plan is in place for the operation and monitoring of the dam structure and includes emergency response protocols in the unlikely event of a dam breach. We review the plan annually or when there is a change in regulation to make sure they are kept up-to-date and follow current best practice. We work closely with Auckland Emergency Management (Civil Defence), on the development of our emergency response plan.

Dam monitoring and safety procedures

Our team of experts monitor the dam environment regularly for any changes:

- At least once weekly
- After heavy rainfall
- After a major earthquake

While a dam breach is highly unlikely, there is a greater risk during an extreme natural event.

Dam flood zone

We undertake flow and inundation modelling of dam breach risk zones. These are available on our website www.watercare.co.nz and search 'Rosedale Dam'.

If you live downstream of the dam, we recommend making yourself familiar with the hazard zone and the location of safe areas outside the flood zone.
