Haycock Avenue site

About the Haycock Avenue construction site

The Haycock Avenue shaft site is one of five smaller sites we are building along a connector tunnel. This tunnel then feeds into the main Central Interceptor tunnel at the May Road site. The purpose of this section is to divert flows from our current older Western network into the new Central Interceptor tunnel which takes the wastewater to Mangere Wastewater Treatment Plant.

The construction at this site will include building of a shaft and diversion chamber connection to both the Western Interceptor and the local network.

What you will notice

The construction works are due to start on 26 March 2020 and will take approximately 17 months.

During the construction period, the road will be one-way with traffic

able to exit only from Haycock Avenue to White Swan Road. During the creation of the diversion chamber and connection to the Western Interceptor, the road will need to be closed for four months. Traffic diversions and signage to direct traffic will be in place during this time.

When the construction works are complete, the road will return to normal operations and the Haycock Avenue site will be reinstated to a grass surface.

When the tunnel is commissioned in 2023, we will return to connect the flows from the Western Interceptor.

Proposed work programme

The first activities will be to set up traffic management and temporary fencing around the site. We will then deconstruct and remove the two properties at 2 and 4 Haycock Avenue. This will be followed by installation of site fencing and clearing the site to create a platform for building of the shaft and structures.

Work programme update



Working with you

We understand that construction sites for major projects such as the Central Interceptor can be disruptive and noisy at times. We aim to be a good neighbour while we are working in your area and will work to minimise disruption, where we can.

We will keep you informed with what's happening with regular communications. We will be out in your community during the works to meet with you and answer any questions you may have.

Our contractor will hold a 'Meet the Contractor' BBQ for our neighbours and the community before work starts (details below).

How will construction affect you?

- General work hours will be between 7am to 6pm, Monday to Friday, and 8am to 6pm on Saturdays.
- For the safety of the public and workers, traffic management will be in place along Haycock Avenue. The traffic management during the works, includes a one-way detour for about eleven months from White Swan Road onto Haycock Avenue and a temporary road closure for about four months during the construction of the diversion chamber to the Western Interceptor.
- Access to driveways will be maintained. You may experience short delays for entering/exiting driveways as trucks are operating in the area.
- Parking restrictions will be in place along a section of Haycock Avenue to allow for truck movements. Signage will be in place to assist with 'no-parking' areas.
- Truck movements will be restricted Monday to Friday during school terms between 8:15am and 9:15 am and 2:45pm and 3:15pm.
- Noise levels and vibration will be managed in accordance with Council requirements. Noise barriers and fencing will be used during the works to minimise noise.
